Julian felt like a king in his kingdom, like _Alexander the Great_ must have felt in Macedonia.



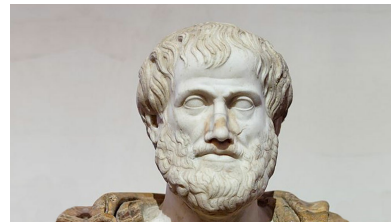

I wonder what it felt like for _Athena_ to be born from Zeus's head!



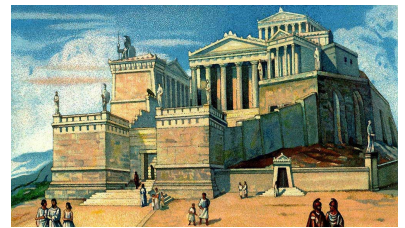

The _city-state_ of Athens once operated like a small country.



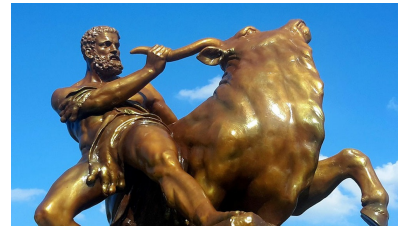

The wrestler's teammates started calling him _Hercules_ because of his amazing strength.



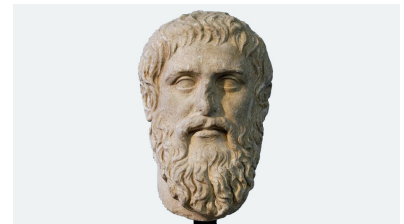

Plato was probably proud of all his philosophy students, but I bet Aristotle was his favorite, because he went on to be a philosopher as well.



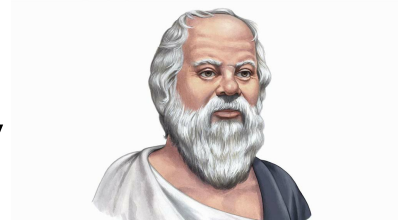

Stop acting like a philosopher; you're not _Socrates_.



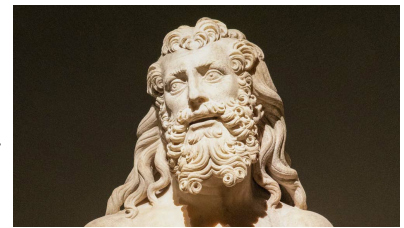
