an often organized effort to avoid doing or buying something as an act of protest.

In Montgomery, Alabama in 1955, many Black Americans participated in a _boycott_ of city buses, refusing to ride them in protest of segregated seating.

Boycott can also be used as a noun, like in this sentence: "When I heard about the company's unfair working conditions, I decided to _boycott_ all of their products."

a territory that is governed by another country.

In 1776, the people living in each American _colony_ declared their independence from England's control.
