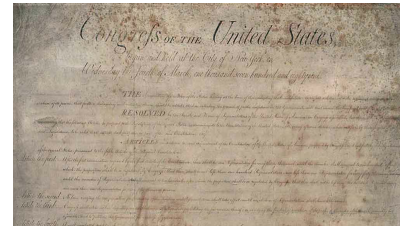

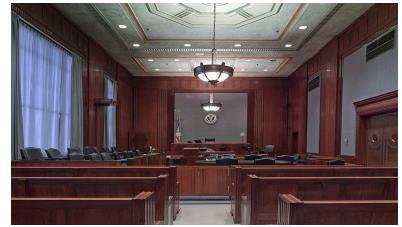

The _jury_ returned from deliberation with their verdict.



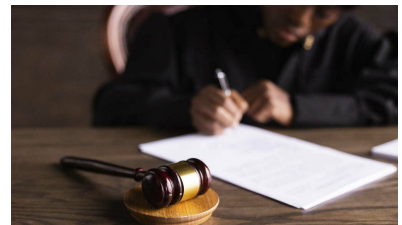

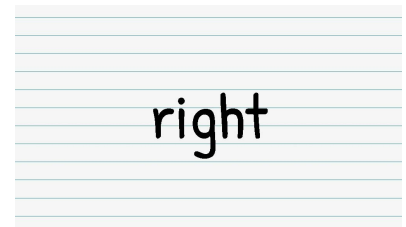
