kingdoms were constantly at war over land and	d resources		was born as a way	
to maintain order. It was the main social, economic, and political system of medieval Europe for centuries.				
Under the feudal system, land, or	_, was granted to peop	ole in exchange for va	ried services. Kings	
gave fiefs to nobles, who, in return, provided n	nilitary and financial aid	d to defend the kingd	om. Nobles divided	
their fiefs into smaller territories to distribute	to	who protected t	the land from	
attacks, considered	the lowest class in th	e feudal hierarchy, m	ade up the	
majority of the population. They played a cruc	ial role in fueling the fe	eudal economy by wo	orking the land for	
nobles and knights in exchange for homes and	protection.			
As trade and commerce expanded during the I	_ate Middle Ages, man	y peasants moved to	cities to seek	
better opportunities, weakening the	's co	ntrol over their land.	The growth of the	
middle class and an economy based on money	instead of	e	eventually led to	
the decline of the feudal system.
