gaining access to it appears to be an impossible task. The term "	" was
coined in the late 1940s to describe situations that seem nightmarish or reminis	cent of the scenarios that
Kafka's characters face.	
During his lifetime, Kafka published very little and burned about 90 percent of h	nis work. After his death in
1924, his friend, Max Brod, found a letter asking his remaining manuscripts to be	burned. But Brod went
against Kafka's wishes and published his work	Because of this
decision, Kafka's stories are still widely read today and recognized as influential i	in modern literature.
