colonize]>

the sending of settlers or military forces (by a country) to another place in order to establish control over it.

The British government sent the Jamestown Company to the New World in order to _colonize_ the land and control its resources.

debt]>

something that is owed or must be paid back, especially money.

I still have some _debt_ that I hope to repay soon.

Synonyms: deficit, liability

Huron]>

a Native American people who lived along Lake Ontario. They encountered French settlers and trappers along the St. Lawrence River and sided with the French in the French and Indian War.

Representatives of the _Huron_ nation first encountered the French in 1615 when they met French explorer Samuel de Champlain. Later, they would side with the French in the French and Indian War.

native to a certain place.

The Navajo, an _Indigenous_ tribe, lived in the Southwest for centuries before the creation of the United States.

Synonyms: native, domestic

Iroquois]>

a confederacy of Native American people living in the Northeastern United states. The name means "People of the Longhouse." They sided with the British in the French and Indian War because of a long feud with the Huron.

The five nations of the _Iroquois_ include the Mohawk, Onondaga, Seneca, Oneida and Cayuga peoples.

resource]>

a supply of something, such as money or goods, that can be used by a person or country.

Money, trees and time are each an example of a _resource_.
