the seventh president of the United States (1829-1837). He was a general in the War of 1812. In 1830, he signed the Indian Removal Act.

As founder of the Democratic Party, _Andrew Jackson_ ran for president promising to represent the common man, and he won.

the act or state of being forced to leave one's home or country.

The fire in the apartment building led to the _displacement_ of 50 residents, who had to stay in hotels for a few weeks.



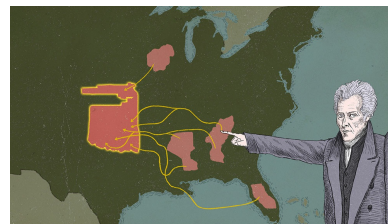

Indian Removal]>

a policy of the United States government in the 19th century. Indigenous peoples were forcibly removed from their land in the eastern United States to lands west of the Mississippi River.

The US government created a policy of _Indian Removal_ in the 19th century, forcing Natives from their lands to make room for White settlers.

Louisiana Purchase]>

the 1803 acquisition of France's Louisiana Territory by the United States.

The _Louisiana Purchase_, which consisted of land between the Mississippi River and the Rocky Mountains, nearly doubled the size of the United States.

populist]>

of or related to a kind of politics with the goal of helping ordinary people, especially those who think their opinions and needs are ignored by the rich and powerful.

Populist ideas became popular as more and more regular people realized the dishonesty of those in power.

Supreme Court]>

the highest court in the United States.

As the highest court in the US, the _Supreme Court_ interprets federal law and rules on dozens of cases a year.

Trail of Tears]>

the route along which the United States government forced several Indigenous nations, including the Cherokee, Seminole, Chickasaw, Choctaw, and Creek, to migrate to reservations west of the Mississippi River from the 1820s through the 1840s.

Many Natives died while being forced to leave their ancestral lands to march west on the _Trail of Tears_.

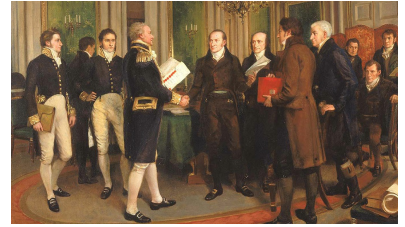

an official agreement between two or more countries or groups.

The US accused Russia of violating their _treaty_, but Russia says it has not broken the agreement.
