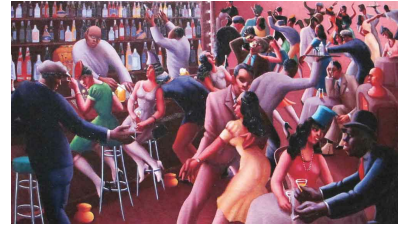


Harlem Renaissance ,]>

During the _Harlem Renaissance_, Black artists and intellectuals gathered in northern Manhattan to share and enjoy their thriving music and culture.



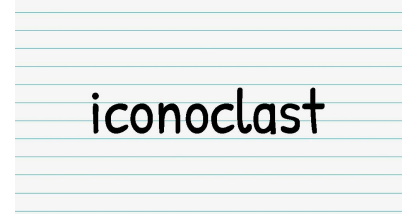

one who challenges or criticizes popular or established beliefs, ideas, customs, etc.

A true _iconoclast_, Nicolaus Copernicus challenged the common belief that the universe revolved around the Earth. He developed the now-accepted model showing the sun at the center of the universe.

infamy; being well known, often in a bad regard.

The petty thief gained _notoriety_ in his later years and is now known for those infamous violent crimes.

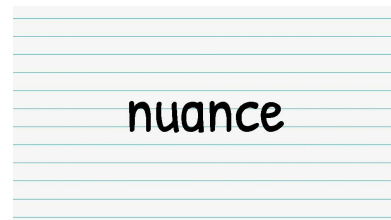

subtle differences, qualities, or complexities in meaning, feeling, tone, etc.

The slight difference between burgundy and maroon is an example of a _nuance_.

racism]>

the belief that one race of people is superior to others, and/or the actions or policies resulting from that belief.

Segregation and policies that sought to disenfranchise Black voters were motivated by _racism_.

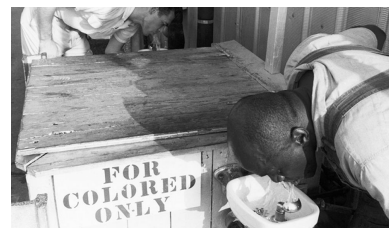
segregation]>

the act, process, or policy of separating people of different races, sexes, religions, etc.

For many years, laws in the United States allowed _segregation_. There were separate schools and even water fountains for White people and Black people.
