Franklin Roosevelt]>

an American statesman and political leader who served as the 32nd President of the United States from 1933 until his death in 1945. He won a record four presidential elections and led the government during most of the Great Depression and World War II.

The 32nd President of the US, _Franklin D. Roosevelt_, served a record four terms, longer than any other US president.

Fred Korematsu]>

a Japanese American who refused to vacate his home and relocate to an internment camp during World War II. He appealed his conviction to the Supreme Court in **Korematsu v. United States** in 1944.

Even though he was born in the US, _Fred Korematsu_ and other Japanese Americans were forced to live in internment camps.



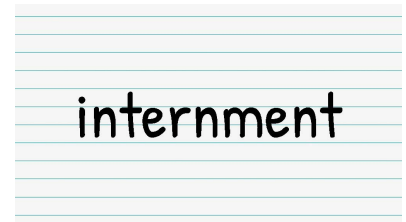

false or biased information that is used to make the general public feel a certain way about a political issue or situation.

The political party used _propaganda_ to try to gain support for the war and convince people to support their plans.

the highest court in the United States.
