John Steinbeck was born in 190:	2 in Salinas, California	a. The author of 16 novels, six nonfiction books, and two	
collections of short stories, he is	considered one of th	he most

Steinbeck often wrote about the	e lives of the working	g class and the environments they lived in, inspired by	
his own experience laboring on f	arms and ranches. Th	he Grapes of Wrath, published in 1939, depicts a family	
of farme	farmers moving from Oklahoma to California during the Dust Bowl. It was		
celebrated as a	portrai	it of the bitterness, anxiety, and	
millic	ons of Americans face	ed during the Great Depression, and it won the Pulitzer	
Prize for Fiction. Other well know	vn works include Of 1	Mice and Men, East of Eden, and The Pearl.	
In 1962, Steinbeck was awarded	the Nobel Prize in Lit	terature "for his realistic and imaginative writings,	
combining as they do sympathet	ic humour and	social perception." He died in 1968, leaving	
behind a literary	of portraying th	ne strife of everyday people.
