an amendment to the US Constitution that ended slavery throughout the country. It was ratified in 1865.

While many enslaved people were freed by the Emancipation Proclamation, it wasn't until the ratification of the _13th Amendment_ that slavery itself was abolished.

President Lincoln issued the _Emancipation Proclamation_ in 1863. The act freed all the slaves living in Confederate states not yet under Union control during the Civil War.
