Loving v. Virginia - Vocab Cards

14th Amendment]>

an amendment to the US Constitution that defined citizenship and extended US citizenship to formerly enslaved persons. It also prevented states from restricting the basic rights of citizens or other persons. It was ratified in 1868.

The _14th Amendment_ states, "All persons born or naturalized in the United States...are citizens of the United States and of the state wherein they reside."

an organization founded in 1920 that works to protect Americans' constitutional rights and freedoms.
