Adventures of Tom Sawyer an air of authentic	ity.
His knack for capturing American life was cou	upled with a biting sense of humor he used to satirize Americar
culture and norms. His novel Adventures of H	uckleberry Finn aimed to expose American
when it came t	o racism, slavery, and the failures of Reconstruction.
Twain died in 1910, but his public persona, hu	mor, and discerning worldview was massively influential in
