The Quran is the holy book of _Islam_. It contains the teachings of Muhammad.



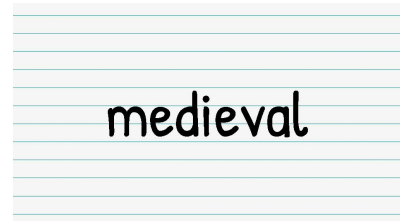

I love learning about the Middle Ages and can't wait for the museum's upcoming _medieval_ art exhibit.



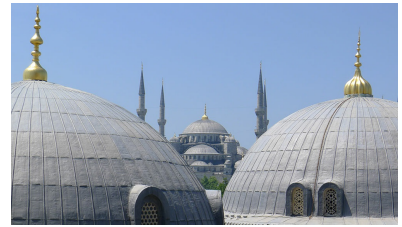

When he heard the call to prayer broadcast from the tall minaret of the _mosque_, Abbaas rushed in to join his family in worship.



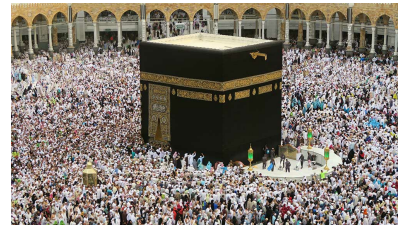

Every year, people embark on a _pilgrimage_ to sacred places like Mecca, Jerusalem and Lumbini to better connect with their religion.



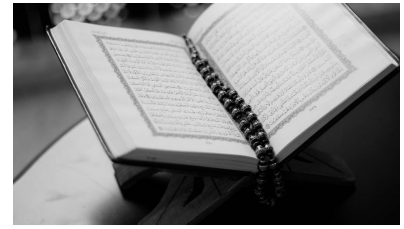

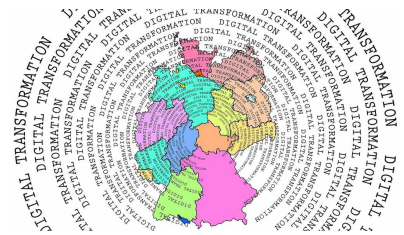
