The was first recognized in the year 2000. It contains the		
world's largest ocean current, which runs eastward for over 13,000 miles!		
World's largest occarried, which rails caseward for over 15,000 miles.		
The is the world's smallest. Much of it is covered by polar ice—but		
the ice is melting more and more as the Earth's climate changes.
