a member of the largest liberal political party of the United States, which supports a strong federal government, higher taxes and progressive social issues.

electoral college]>

a group of people chosen from each state who come together to elect the President and Vice President of the United States.

The President and Vice President of the United State are officially elected by the _electoral college_, a group of people who vote based on the popular vote in their state.

general election]>

a regularly scheduled election in which final candidates are selected for government office.

After a narrow primary win, I became my party's only candidate in the _general election_.

a person who has been formally selected to run for an elected office, perform a duty, or receive an honor.

After the primaries, she became the Republican _nominee_ for president and will go on to run in the general election.

an election to appoint delegates to a party conference or to select the candidates for a general, especially presidential, election

Republican]>

a member of the largest conservative party in the United States, which supports lower taxes, less government intervention in economics and conservative social policies.

running mate]>

a person chosen by a candidate for an election to be given a subordinate office if they win.

He is running for president but has not yet chosen his _running mate_. We don't know who would be his vice president.

a US state where the two major political parties have similar levels of support among voters.
