the 16th president of the United States (1861–1865). He led the Union during the Civil War and brought an end to slavery in the United States.

Having led the country during the turbulence of the Civil War, _Abraham Lincoln_ played an important and highly respected role in US history.

to bring or come to an end.

to admit defeat.

deprecate]>

to express disapproval of something.

The politician _deprecated_ her opponent's plan for tax reform. Many people agreed with her criticism.

Synonyms: disapprove, object, frown on

to melt away or break apart.

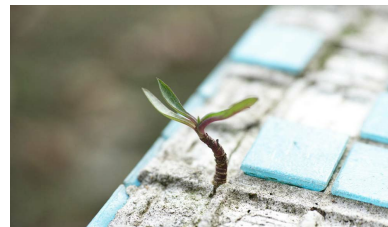
endure]>

Antonyms: die, end, perish



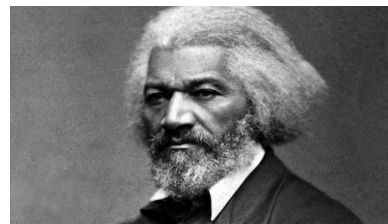

Frederick Douglass]>

American abolitionist and orator. A former slave, he fought for abolition before the Civil War and served as an advisor to President Lincoln. After the war, he served in public office under five presidents.

After escaping slavery, _Frederick Douglass_ became an abolitionist, orator and presidential advisor.

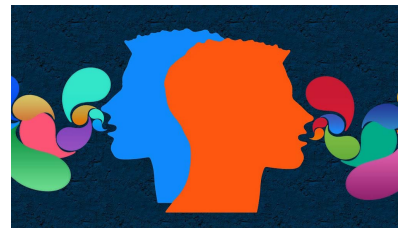
