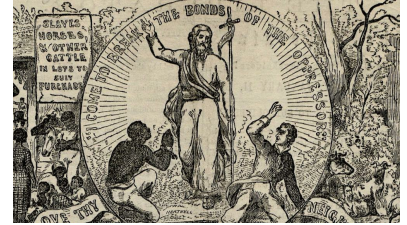

the ending of slavery in the United States.

Before the Civil War, many of those who did not believe in slavery fought for _abolition_.

the act of working for a cause or issue, participating in demonstrations and organizing to change something about one's world or community.

The young girl impressed everyone with her dedication and _activism_. She sent out a petition and organized a boycott to change the grocery store's policy.

a change or addition to a legal document, like a bill or constitution.

The US Founding Fathers didn't put free speech in the original Constitution, but they eventually added an _amendment_ guaranteeing it to all citizens.
