a battle of the War of 1812 that took place in present-day Ontario, Canada in 1813. With General William Henry Harrison's troops approaching, British troops retreated, leaving their Shawnee Native American allies outnumbered. During Harrison's victory, Tecumseh, the Shawnee leader, was killed.

Greatly outnumbered, Tecumseh was killed at the _Battle of the Thames_ in 1813. As Tecumseh's confederacy fell apart, William Henry Harrison enjoyed acclaim for his military success.

Battle of Tippecanoe]>

an 1811 battle between General William Henry Harrison's troops and Shawnee Native Americans at Prophetstown in present-day Indiana. Harrison's army won and burned Prophetstown to the ground in the process. Tecumseh, the Shawnee leader, was away while the battle took place.

William Henry Harrison rose to fame after his 1811 victory over Shawnee Native Americans in the _Battle of Tippecanoe_.

In search of a capital for his confederacy of Native Americans, Tecumseh and his brother, Tenskwatawa, founded _Prophetstown_ in 1808 in present-day Indiana.

William Henry Harrison]>

an American military general and politician who served as the ninth President of the United States from March 4, 1841 until his death on April 4, 1841. He is the shortest tenured president in US History.

"Tippecanoe and Tyler Too" was _William Henry Harrison's_ slogan during his 1840 presidential campaign. It reminded voters of his military past and proved to be a winning strategy.
