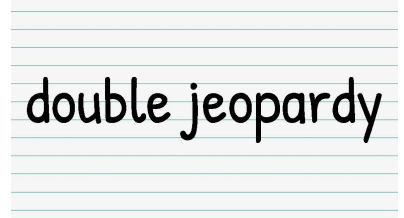

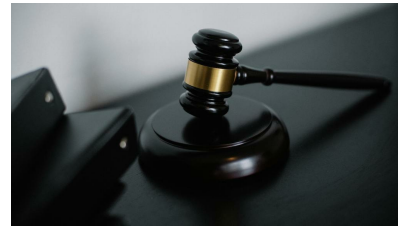
incrimination]>

The suspect's fingerprints were found at the scene. This is evidence for _incrimination_.

Antonyms: justification, exoneration



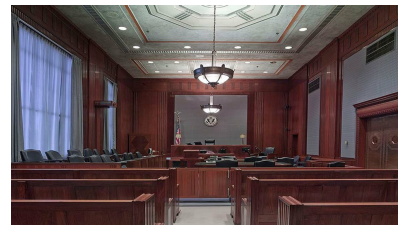
