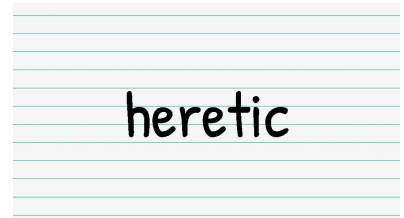
heretic]>

In the 1500s, a disillusioned priest named Martin Luther founded _Protestantism_.



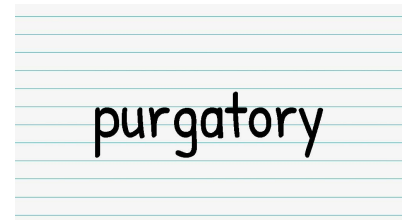
