

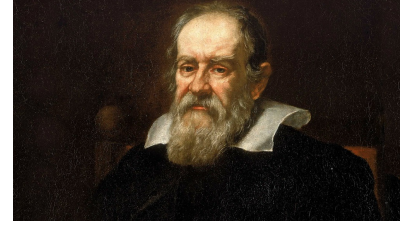

Galileo Galilei]>

an Italian astronomer and physicist in the early 17th century. The Catholic Church's Inquisition forced him to withdraw his support for Copernicus's theory of the solar system in 1616.

Italian astronomer _Galileo Galilei_ was persecuted for supporting the idea that the sun is at the center of the solar system.

an Italian artist, musician, engineer and scientist in the 15th and 16th centuries. His famous works include The Last Supper and the Mona Lisa.

The Protestant Reformation in Germany was led by the theologian _Martin Luther_, whose actions led him to be excommunicated from the Catholic Church in 1521.



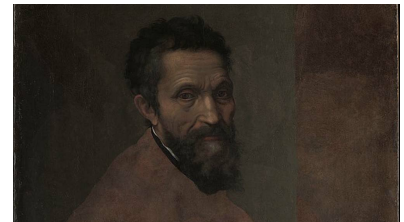

an Italian artist, architect and poet who worked in the 15th and 16th centuries. His famous works include David and the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel.

The Italian artist, writer and architect _Michelangelo_ created many of the Renaissance's most recognizable works, including the statue of David and a large painting on the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel.

Nicolaus Copernicus]>

a **Polish astronomer who, in 1543, published a theory that the earth and other planets move around the sun.**

In 1543, Polish astronomer _Nicolaus Copernicus_ shared his theory that the planets of our solar system orbit around the sun.

Protestant]>

a **member of one of the Christian churches that separated from the Catholic church during the Reformation.**

the period in Europe from the 14th to the 17th centuries during which art, literature and learning flourished.

Scientific Revolution]>

a period of advances in European sciences, mathematic and philosophy from 1500-1700.
