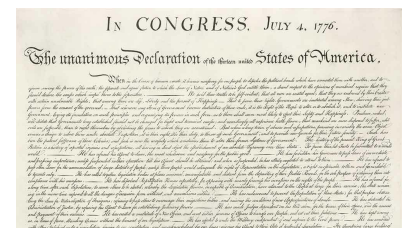

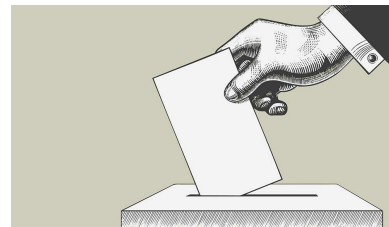

a form of government in which power is held by the people, who vote to elect their representatives.
