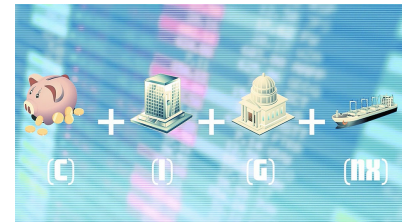

Casey makes sure to eat well and get regular checkups because personal _healthcare_ is very important to her.



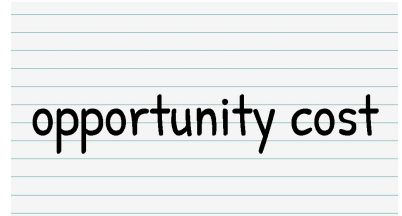
