From 1809-1817, _James Madison_ served as the 4th president of the United States. He helped draft the Constitution and some of The Federalist Papers.





an area of land claimed by a government but without an organized government of its own.

France sold the United States a huge tract of land called the Louisiana _Territory_ for them to divide and govern as they saw fit.
