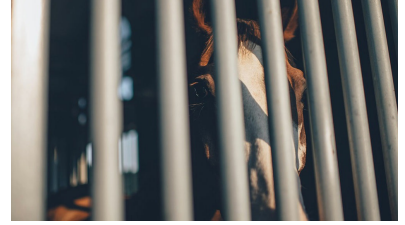
captivity]>

to cause to start.

The stock market crash of 1929 _initiated_ a severe economic downturn, now known as the Great Depression.

Synonyms: launch, bring about

Antonyms: conclude, finish, terminate

periodic]>

occurring occasionally and/or regularly.

The cabins were subjected to _periodic_ inspections, so the campers kept them very clean.

Synonyms: regular, recurring

consistent bad treatment of people in a specific racial, ethnic, or cultural group; the condition of being treated this way.

After years of religious _persecution_, many fled in search of a safer place where they might be free.
