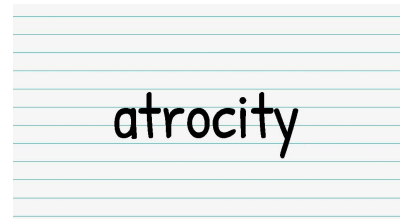

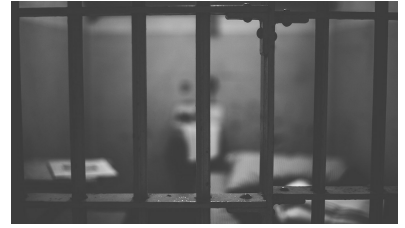
**imprison ]>**

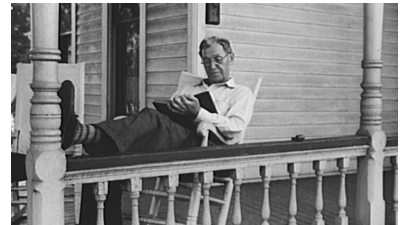
**resident ]>**

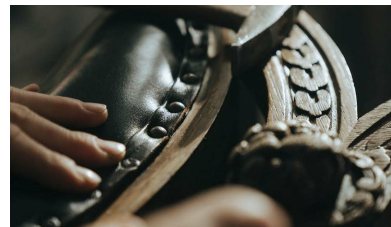
**revive ]>**
